

OBJECTIVES FOR THIS SESSION

HOW TO START:

- •Use our **Core Curriculum Overview** document as a guide for helping you put together your course preferences.
- •In your **Course Preference List** try to include three to four classes that would allow you to explore subjects you are considering for a **potential major** or are other areas of interest.
- •Some majors have courses you should take in your first semester. If you are thinking about **Engineering, any health sciences, or education,** discuss this in your chat session with faculty.
- •If you took **AP or Dual Credit** courses in high school, do not preference those now. We will advise you about processes for transfer credit.

For Math and Language

TAKE THE LANGUAGE PLACEMENT EXAM

All students must take a two-course sequence in one language (WL; World Languages CCR)

Did you take French, German, Latin or Spanish in high school?

If your answer is yes, you must take the placement exam for that language. Students who did not take a language in high school will not take a placement exam.

- You will have a choice to either continue your high school language, or start with a new language.
- We strongly encourage you to complete your language in your first-year.
- Students with 3+ years of a high school language must begin their language sequence at 116 or above.
- We cannot enroll you in your high school language if you do not take the placement exam for that language
- You can select a language course on your preference list. We will place you into the level you need.
